Small Bowel Series

Test Name:	Small Bowel	Series

Description: This procedure uses a contrast agent

called Barium to obtain images of your

small bowel.

How to Prepare: Nothing to eat, drink, or any medication 8

hours prior to exam.

Where & When to Report: Report to the Medical Imaging Department

Registration at least 15 minutes prior to

scheduled exam time.

How long will the test take?: Expect to be here between 1-4 hours. The

exam length will vary depending on each

patient's individual metabolism.

What to expect during the test?: A preliminary x-ray will be taken of your

abdomen. You will then drink two cups of Barium. The technologist will take images directed by the Radiologist every 30-60 minutes until the Barium reaches the end of your small bowel. The Radiologist will obtain images of your small bowel under Fluoroscopy [also known as 'Live x-ray']. The Radiologist may use a device to place pressure on certain areas of your abdomen to better visualize your bowel on the x-ray

images.

What to expect after the test?: Barium can cause constipation. It is normal

to have whitish colored stools for 24-48 following the exam. You should increase fluid intake for 24 – 48 hours after the exam to help eliminate the Barium.
