

Nuclear Medicine Gallbladder | HIDA| Scan

Test Name: Nuclear Medicine Gallbladder [HIDA] Scan

Description: Functional testing of the Gallbladder; this

test evaluates how well the gallbladder is

working and whether it is emptying

properly.

How to Prepare: Nothing to eat, drink, or smoke after

midnight. No narcotics 4-6 hrs prior to the

test.

Where & When to Report: Report to the Medical Imaging Department

Registration at least 15 minutes prior to

scheduled exam time.

How long will the test take?: Expect to be here for 2 - 4 hours; exam

length will vary based on each patient's

gallbladder function.

What to expect during the test?: Patient will receive a small injection of a

Radiotracer into the arm or an IV. Images will be taken while patient lies flat under the camera for 1 hour. Delayed images may be taken for increments up to 4 hours. Patient

will be allowed to sit between images.

What to expect after the test?: There are no symptoms or side effects

from this test.
